# Vote Solar Poll Results


# Overview

- Survey conducted January 25 to February 2, 2022.
- 1360 surveys completed by adults living in Pennsylvania, including an oversample of residents living in the southwest region of the state.
- Modeled margin of error: +/- 2.4%.
- Survey fielded online using Change Research/Embold's proprietary Dynamic Online Sampling Engine.
- Data weighted to accurately depict the state's gender, age, education, 2020 vote, and regional distribution.








How concerned are you personally about climate change?










# Increasing Solar Production

Would you like Pennsylvania to produce more or less solar electricity?




Would you like your community or region to produce more or less solar electricity?








Do the following statements make you more or less supportive of solar electricity?

Do the following statements make you more or less supportive of solar electricity? [Much more supportive]






